In community news, please see information from Aaron French, MSN, RN, our Morrisville Public Health District Director from the Vermont Department of Health, regarding changes to Medicaid that could impact many of our community members. Some news from our Director of Early Education, Melinda Mascolino:

"We are so pleased to report that our LNSU PreK students had excellent results on the fall Teaching Strategies Gold Assessment. These are remarkable results given the time period that these students may have experienced isolation from typical daycare experiences due to the pandemic.

Our PreK teachers collected learning evidence from last September until December 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022. There are six learning categories for both three- and four-year-old students. This evidence is collected twice a year and is a requirement of all licensed PreK programs in the state of Vermont".

## Results for three-year-old students:

- Cognitive 94.1% of the students met or exceeded expectations.
- Mathematics 86.71% of the students met or exceeded expectations.
- Physical 78.72% of the students met or exceeded expectations.
- Literacy 72.27% of the students met or exceeded expectations.
- Language 78.66% of students met or exceeded the expectations.
- Social/Emotional 78.1% of the students met or exceeded expectations.

## Results for four-year-old students:

- Cognitive 87% of the students met or exceeded expectations.
- Mathematics 76.52% of the students met or exceeded expectations.
- Physical 94.2% of the students met or exceeded expectations.
- Literacy 83.5% of the students met or exceeded expectations.
- Language 88.16% of students met or exceeded the expectations.
- Social/Emotional 78.76% of the students met or exceeded expectations.

We recognize that roughly between six and 27 percent of our students are currently not meeting the expectations. It is important to remember that the standards are meant to be end-of-the-year expectations and students have until June to meet these.

## IMPORTANT DATE: Pre-Kindergarten registration will open for all eligible students on February 16, 2023.

We want to reiterate that our road crews are the experts who guide us in making all weather-related decisions about closing schools or keeping them open. Although our television reporters are helpful, they report from Burlington and are not on the roads in our towns. Even in our own County, for example, roads in Cambridge can be very different from roads in Eden or Hyde Park. We will never second guess our road crews, who are our best source of information about the roads. Rarely, weather will be optimal for busses and then Mother Nature will intervene and the weather will do something unexpected. This happened on Thursday, when it began to rain before it was predicted to start. Even still, our crews took steps to optimize safety. Our bus drivers know that they can pull over at any time and call for support from the crews if needed. All busses and riders were safe.

As a final note on this, parents and caregivers can always keep their youth home on days when they are concerned about road safety. Our crews work tirelessly to keep us safe and we extend our thanks and gratitude for their commitment to our safety.

As always, I continue to be so grateful for our Lamoille North community members and the strong relationships we have built together. Thank you again for your collaboration, compassion and dedication to the wellbeing of our students, staff and families.
